Vision Statement

Ensuring, through support, all students are provided with equal opportunities to reach their potential irrespective of sex, gender identity or sexual orientation.

Implementation

Below are statements that articulate how Sunshine Beach State High School will achieve the above aim:

- recognition that every student is different and decisions will be made on a case-by-case basis;
- privacy of student information;
- use of respectful and inclusive language at all times;
- support for students to use their preferred name or pronoun;
- use of bathrooms or change rooms;
- student dress code.;
- participation in sport;
- communication with parents or carers;
- inclusive teaching and learning programs;
- professional development for staff;
- celebration of individuality;
- prompt response to bullying, harassment or discrimination;
- students will be supported in their choice of personal pronoun in everyday use;
- Sunshine Beach State High School supports the right of each child to dress in accordance with their gender identity.
